 Emma Lazarus, *The New Colossus*

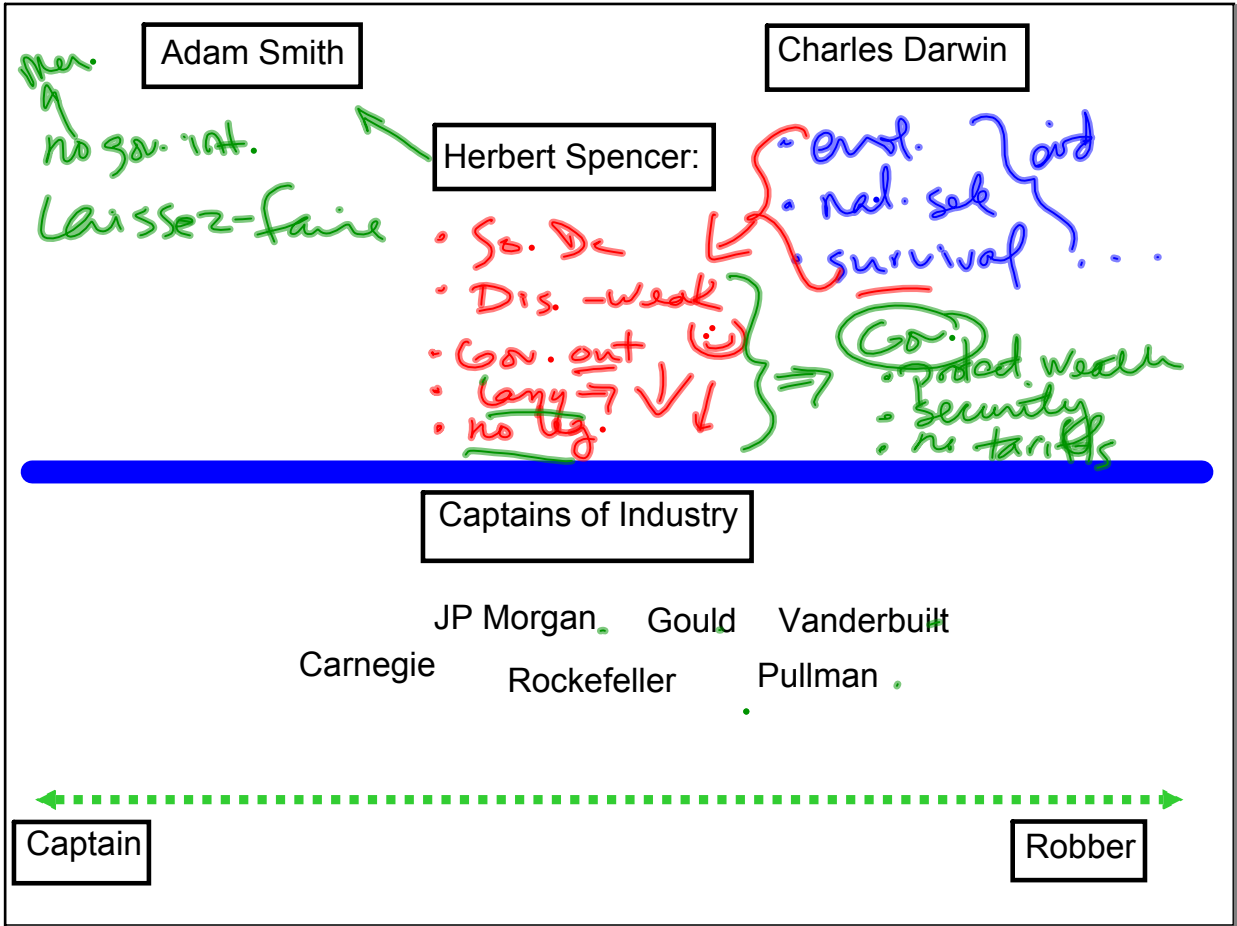
