Write a few sentences that explain and analyze ONE of the documents. Remember, you must address ONE of the following: POV, purpose, audience, context.

Due to the Puritan ideal of Calvinism, a premium was placed on hard work + service to the lord. Many Puritans were fearful of appearing lazy, as evidenced in Document 1. The writer, a dying Puritan, wanted to be sure that his legacy was not one of idleness. His desire to appear in service of the lord was a common Puritan value; those who appeared saved, known as the Visible Saints, were thought to be headed for heaven. This concept of hard ~~to~~ work would eventually establish the idea of the "Puritan work ethic," a key component of American capitalism - that through hard work comes success.
