



The SpAm war! 1898

1898: A turning point

- Cubans fight for independence from Spain (1895)
- Reconcentration (1896)
- USS Maine explodes (Feb. 1898)
- April 1898: Congress declares war on Spain;
 adopted the Teller Amendment, saying U.S. would leave control of Cuba to the natives
- May 1898: Commodore Dewey attacks Manila (Phillipines); destroys enemy fleet but must wait for reinforcements to storm the forts; captures the city in August
- July 1898: Hawaii is annexed

Invading Cuba

- Spain's resources suck
- America RULES!
 - Invade July 1 1898
 - Rough Riders: TR,
 volunteers, win in the
 Battle of San Juan
 Hill, decisive blow to
 Spain

Almost 5,500 Americans die (most from disease)



Treaty of Paris (Again!)

- Congress Approves Treaty of Paris Feb 1899
 - US gains control of Cuba, PR, Guam, Philippines
 - Pay Spain \$20 million
 - Issue the Platt Amendment: allows U.S. to intervene in Cuba, limits Cuba's power of foreign affairs, gives U.S. base at Guantanamo
 - Overturned in 1934 Treaty of Relations between US/Cuba

Dealing with Cuba and PR

- 1900: Foraker Act establishes limited self-rule in PR. Later granted U.S. citizenship
- The problem: does the American Constitution have to be upheld in all territories?
 - 1901-1905: Insular Cases; Supreme Court hears cases involving disputes over whether or not citizens in conquered territories were fully protected by the Constitution; ruling held that American rule does not equal American rights

What to do with our "little brown brothers" in the Philippines

- Filipinos assume they will be free
- U.S. wants for commercial/protectionism purposes
- Feb. 1899: Revolt against U.S. led by Emilio Aguinaldo; crushed by U.S. troops (4,000 Americans, 600,000 Filipinos die)
- U.S. remains in power until 1946
